Further to the seed grant approved by African Development Bank through the Directorate of Technical Cooperation in Africa (Ministry of Foreign Affairs Nigeria) for Sidi Osho Foundation (SOF) to Promote Skills. Entrepreneurship and Leadership Development in Zambian youth to Eradicate Un- employment and promote Self -Employment; the Staff of SOF went on a fact finding mission in Lusaka, Zambia from 17th – 24th March 2017. - \triangleright On Monday the 20th of March, the Team had a meeting African development Bank AfDB office; where we Zambia met with Mr Domoni Kitabire, the Resident Representative and other

staff of AfDB including Philip Boahen: Principal Country Program Officer and members to announce our presence in the country and also to state our mission. We gave a detailed presentation using 46 Slides and more. А detailed presentation was given by the SOF team to give them insight into the project mission and vision in Zambia. The meeting was successful verv and productive certain issues where raise and keen areas

of interest were noted. AfDB helped to pave way to the offices and staff to meet with while in Zambia.

- On Tuesday the 21^{st} of March 2017, we had a \geq meeting with the Mr Owen Mugemezulu, Permanent Secretary of Higher A detailed education. presentation was given by the **SOF** team to give them insight into the project mission and vision in The Zambia. Permanent Secretary was happy about the project and also gave us more information regarding the educational system in the country. He recommended that we have a chat with the technical educational, vocational and entrepreneurship training (TEVETA). authority He facilitated the meeting with an official letter of introduction to the DG TEVETA.
- We met with Mr David Chakonta, the Director General of **TEVETA**, and also at the meeting was Mr Cleophas Takaiza, Director Training Standards; who

were also happy about the project and was willing the assist in certain areas of interest especially with Vocational Training Institutions across Zambia.

- We then went ahead to the \geq first institution which was the Open University of Zambia. We had a meeting the Prof Yerokun Olusegun, Vice Chancellor, Mr Frank W. Chikange, the Registrar and other key members of staff. А detailed presentation was given by the SOF team to give them insight into the project and vision mission in Zambia. The Vice chancellor was glad as he confirmed to us that the project will go a long way in helping the youths in Zambia. Various issues were raised and also verified and with the possibility of an MOU.
- \triangleright On Wednesday the 22nd of March 2017, we had a meeting with Stanbic bank. A detailed presentation was given by the SOF team to give them insight into the project mission and vision in Zambia. It was necessary to discuss with a Bank in the Country due to the Enterprise nature of the project. The Stanbic Bank were pleased about the project and showed support by informing us to inform them when the Training Program starts.
- On Wednesday the 22nd of March 2017 also we then went ahead to visit the University of Zambia where we met with the Prof Enala Tembo – Mwase; Deputy Vice Chancellor, Dr Benson Chishala, Dean of School of

Agricultural Sciences and other members of Staff of the School of Agricultural Sciences. А detailed presentation was given by the SOF team to give them insight into the project mission and vision in Zambia. We were able to gather more information about the university which included the total number of students in the university. The meeting was a productive one and the university agreed to work with SOF.

- On Thursday, the 23rd of March we went back to visit the Zambian Open university where we clarified issues raised from the previous meeting and we reached an agreement with respect to the MoU
